Consultations on the Development of a Federal Framework for Suicide Prevention

The Federal Framework for Suicide Prevention Act (the Act) received Royal Assent on December 14, 2012, requiring the Government of Canada to develop a federal framework for suicide prevention.

The Act recognizes that suicide, in addition to being a mental health issue, is a public health issue and a health and safety priority. It is expected that a federal framework for suicide prevention will serve as a plan to guide Government of Canada efforts in six key areas described within the Act... Read more.


